Dissertation Writing Awards

- 137 individuals have received dissertation writing awards that aim to support doctoral candidates while they complete their dissertations toward getting a PhD, including over 20 in the last four years.
- Nearly 90 went on to professorial or equivalent positions at universities and other institutions of higher education over 70 scholars at 60 institutions in the United States, 5 institutions in Turkey, and 15 elsewhere in the world.
- An additional 12 individuals who received this award went on to senior research, curatorial, or other positions at US think tanks, museums, and libraries relevant to the qualifications and experiences they gained through the Turkish/Ottoman studies that ITS supported.
- This ITS support helped add tremendous breadth and depth to US higher education on Turkey and top-level American scholarly expertise in studies pertaining to it.
